### **Hon'ble Late Adv. Mr. Abdul Kadir Khan Founder President, M.C.E. Society, Pune**

Late Adv. Mr. Abdul Kadir Khan, a renowned, reputed, philanthropist and visionary and legal luminary was born in the year 1894 in Sirur. After completing M. A. and LL.B., he successfully practiced for 40 years as a leading lawyer in Pune. Being an open minded person, he was always willing to listen, adjust and learn. These qualities made him a dynamic personality. He had honour of serving as the President of Pune Bar Association. He also had a distinction of being elected as member of Legislative Assembly, Bombay in 1940. He was a paradigm of existence in promptitude and probity. Being a gifted orator, he was known for his influential and impactful speeches. He had an attitude of 'instilling and inspiring the spirit of positive change'. He was a leader of Muslim League Party. He was a member of the Constituent Assembly and a leader of opposition in Bombay Legislative Assembly. He was the chairman of various committees including Dargah Committee of Ajmer. With an uncanny knack for social transformation, his greatest achievement lay in his ability to create social and legal awareness among masses. His consistent efforts and generosity laid foundations of many welfare schemes. A great man - Adv. A.K. Khan, a legend in the field of academics, law and politics died in June 1980.

To acknowledge the laudable services and pay tribute to late Adv. Mr. Abdul Kadir Khan, the M.C.E. Society established a law college and named after him as 'A.K. Khan Law College'. In the year 2007, the college was upgraded into A.K.K. New Law Academy, Pune.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

### THREE YEAR DEGREE LAW COURSE (LL.B)

It is compulsory for students to appear in entrance exam MAH- Law CET conducted by Commissioner, State Common Entrance Test Cell, Govt of Maharashtra. For details kindly visit [www.mahacet.org](http://www.mahacet.org) / [www.dhepune.gov.in](http://www.dhepune.gov.in)

An applicant who has graduated in any discipline of knowledge from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State legislature or an equivalent national institution recognised as a Deemed to be University or foreign University recognised as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence, may apply for admission into three year degree programme in Law leading to conferment of LL.B. degree on successful completion of the regular programme conducted by University whose degree in Law is recognised by the Bar Council of India for the purpose of enrolment.

### EXPLANATION

An applicant who has passed the 3 years U.G. Degree and 2/3 years P.G. Degree from open or Deemed University recognised by and established under the UGC Act, after pro securing the studies in the pattern of 10+2+3+2/3 with regular studies at secondary and higher secondary schooling (12th Std) is eligible for admission.

But, if the applicant has not studied any of the qualifications prescribed in the pattern of 10+2+3, then he/she will not be eligible for admission to LL.B. Degree course. An applicant will be held eligible, if doesn't have prescribed minimum percentage of marks in aggregate at U.G. degree examination, but has in the final year of U.G. Degree or at the P.G. Degree examination provided, he./she have prosecuted the study pattern in the 10+2+3+2/3 format.

The applicant who has passed the qualifying examination (U.G. or P.G. Degree) in a single sitting examination without having basic qualifications of (10+2+3) is not eligible for admission to 3 year LL.B. course.

### ADMISSION TO SECOND YEAR LL.B COURSE

A student who has taken admission to II LL.B. course of this University, after passing the First LL.B. examination from Savitribai Phule Pune University or any other University recognised by AIU and Bar Council of India will have to appear and pass in the subjects of First LL.B. course of this University in which the has not already passed, in his parent University. Further, if he so desires, he will be exempted in any of the subjects of the Second LL.B. examination of this University in which he has already passed in the parent University.

### ADMISSION TO THIRD YEAR LL.B COURSE

A student passing the Second Year LL.B. (LL.B. General) examination from Savitribai Phule

Pune University or a Statutory Indian University recognised by AIU and Bar Council of India is allowed to seek admission to the Third LL.B. Course in his University on the condition that he shall appear for and pass in all papers prescribed for the First and Second Year LL.B. Course of this University of which he has not passed in his parent university. Further if he so desires, he will be exempted in any of the subject at the Third LL.B. examination of this University if he has already passed in those subjects in the parent University. However, in such a case, he will be required to appear and pass in the deficient papers according to syllabus of First LL.B. /Second LL.B. of this University.

### **INTEGRATED FIVE YEAR DEGREE LAW COURSE (B.A.,LL.B)**

It is compulsory for students to appear in entrance exam MAH- Law CET conducted by Commissioner, State Common Entrance Test Cell, Govt of Maharashtra. For details kindly visit [www.mahacet.org/](http://www.mahacet.org/) [www.dhepune.gov.in](http://www.dhepune.gov.in)

An applicant who has successfully completed Senior Secondary School Course ('+2') or equivalent (such as 11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving certificate course) from a recognised University of India or outside or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognised by the Union or by State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognised by the Government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the programme of the Centres of Legal Education to obtain the integrated degree in law with a degree in any other subject as the first degree from the University whose such a degree in law is recognised by the Bar Council of India for the purpose of enrolment.

An applicant who has successfully completed Pre-University course or Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent such as (10+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving Certificate Course) from a recognized University/Institutions of India or outside or from Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Central or State Government/s of India or from any equivalent institutions form a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of International qualifying certificate equivalent to 10+2 on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the course.

### **EXPLANATIONS**

Provided those applicants who have obtained 12 Std./Higher Secondary Pass Certificate/First Degree certificate or equivalent course through distance or correspondence method, only after passing the basic qualifications (i.e. Secondary Schooling /10th Std. in Regular mode) for prosecuting such correspondence/distance 12th Std./Higher Secondary schooling courses, shall also be considered as eligible for admission to the 5 years LL. B. courses.

Provided further that the applicants who have obtained 12th Std. or Higher Secondary schooling through open Universities system directly without having basic qualification (i.e.10th Std. in regular mode) prescribed for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission to the 5 years LL.B. course.

In case of any doubt and clarification, please refer to rules mentioned in Law CET brochure of Commissioner, State Common Entrance Test Cell, Govt. of Maharashtra, Mumbai.

An applicant who has passed the 11th/12th/Pre Degree Course examination from

State/Central Boards of Schooling or from Open Schooling System recognized & established by the Government of the State/India or International Board of School Education, after prosecuting the basic course of studies in the pattern of 1st to 10th standards in Regular mode, at Secondary Schooling is eligible for admission to five year Integrated LL. B. Course.

The applicant who has passed the prescribed basic qualification i.e. 10th Std./ Secondary Schooling Certificate Examination, in a single sitting examination, without having basic qualification(i.e. 1 to 9th std. of schooling) is not eligible for admission to five year Integrated LL.B. Law Courses. Ref : (Rule 5 (b) of Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008)

“In view of Rules of Legal Education 2008, no candidate from the open University having a degree contrary of the U.G.C. Act and regulations and contrary to legal Education Rules 2008 shall be admitted into law course”.

Ref:(Bar Council of India letter No LE/Cir02/2010 dated 20/2010 )

“No students shall be eligible for the award of the 1st Degree unless he has successfully completed a three year course & this degree may be called the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (General / Honors / Special Degree) as the case may be. Provided no student shall be eligible to seek admission to the Master's course in these faculties, who has not successfully pursued the first Degree course of three years duration.

### **PROHIBITION TO REGISTER FOR TWO REGULAR COURSES**

No student shall be allowed to simultaneously register for a Law degree programme with any other graduate or post graduate of certificate course run by the same or any other university or an institution for academic or professional learning excepting in the integrated degree programme of the same institution.

Provided that any short period part time certificate course on language, computer science or computer application of an institute or any run by a centre for Distance Learning of a University however, shall be exempted.

### **MINIMUM MARKS IN QUALIFYING EXAMINATION FOR ADMISSION**

Bar Council of India may from time to time, stipulate the minimum percentage of marks not below 45% of the total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST applicants, to be obtained for the qualifying examination, such as +2 examination in case of integrated five year course or degree course in any discipline for three year LL.B course, for the purpose of applying for and getting admitted into a Law degree programme of any recognised University in either of the streams.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfil other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the Government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

Ref : (Rule 7 of Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008).

## **EXPLANATION**

Admission for candidates who secured 44.5% marks or more (General Category) & 39.5% and more (SC/ST Category).

The Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants seeking admission to first Year LL.B / B.A. LL.B. Course.

## **PROHIBITION AGAINST LATERAL ENTRY AND EXIT**

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of Graduation in any subject or exit by way of awarding degree splitting the integrated double degree course, at any intermediary stage of integrated double degree course.”

However a University may permit any person to audit any subject or number of subjects by attending classes regularly and taking the tests for obtaining a Certificate of Participation from the University/Faculty according to the rules prescribed by the University from time to time and give a Certificate therefore.

## **Explanation**

“Lateral Entry” is an admission given to graduate applicants at the beginning of third year in an integrated five year Course.

“Lateral Exit” means opting out at the end of three year after successfully completing the courses up to the third year, from an Integrated Five Year course on being awarded a Bachelor Degree. Ref: (Rule 2 (xiv) & (xv) of Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008)

## **AGE FOR ADMISSION**

There is no Maximum age limit for admission into 3 Year and 5 Year Law Courses. The maximum age limit for admission into 3 Year and 5 Year Law courses specified by Bar Council of India at Clause -28, Schedule-III, Rule 11 of the Rules of Legal Education, 2008 has been withdrawn by the Bar Council of India.

## **ON-LINE COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

All prospective students are required to complete the entire admission procedure as per admission schedule notified by the institution on web site - [www.nlapune.org](http://www.nlapune.org) every year before the commencement of the academic year. To facilitate the students, on-line admission procedure has been made available. All prospective applicants are requested to down-load the admission form directly from the website and send the downloaded application form duly filled in. There is no entrance test and admission is based purely on merit at the qualifying examination. The merit list of candidates who are given provisional admission will be displayed in the college notice board and also on the web site. After verification of documents and

payment of fees, their provisional admission will be confirmed. The admissions confirmed by the institution are subject to approval of the Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

The college also reserves the right to deny admission to a prospective student if the management of the institution considers that it will affect the discipline and peaceful atmosphere of the institution and the campus.

### **RULES OF STANDARD OF PASSING**

#### **ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED FOR CONFIRMATION OF ONLINE PROVISIONAL ADMISSION**

At the time of confirmation of online provisional admission, the following documents are required to be submitted at the office of A.K.K. New Law Academy, Pune (NLA) for verification and assessing the eligibility for the course. After verification, all the original documents will be returned to the candidate except T.C. and migration certificates.

- 1) Original mark sheets of qualifying examination (H.S.C. / Degree).
- 2) Date of Birth Certificate.
- 3) School leaving certificate / Transfer Certificate in original.
- 4) In case of student migrating from another University or Board, a migration certificate from that University or Board as the case may be in Original.
- 5) Four copies of the latest identity card size photograph.
- 6) Gap certificate if there is a gap from the date of last study.

#### **FOREIGN STUDENTS' ADMISSION**

Foreign students desirous of securing admission in this college have to obtain "Confirm Letter of Admission" from the International Students Centre, University of Pune and produce the same at the time of admission. After admission all information regarding passport, visa and residential details should be communicated to foreign cell of Commissionerate of Police, Pune.

#### **RULES REGARDING SEMESTER SCHEME**

As mentioned in Circular No 230 of 2003 of University of Pune - Ref. No. ICB/3524 dated 12-6-2003).

Semester Scheme for LL.B. (Three Year Law Course) and B.A. LL.B., (Five years Law course) from Academic year 2003-2004.

#### **THE RULES OF STANDARD OF PASSING**

The examination pattern has been simplified for the semester scheme & it shall be as follows :

- A) Since one subject shall have only one paper during any session, all candidates regular, repeaters of all semesters will appear for the same paper.
- B) The papers for the subjects of B.A. LL.B (5 year) course & LL.B. (3 year) course will however have different code numbers according to the course for identification.

## **PASSING CRITERIA**

To pass the 1st and 2nd years of B.A. LL.B., Examination (Five year) law course a candidate must obtain :

- a) 40% of the full marks in each paper.
- b) 40% of the total marks in the examination.

To pass the 3rd, 4th & 5th year B.A. LL.B. and 1st, 2nd and 3rd year of LL. B. Examination, a candidate must obtain :

- i) 35% of the full marks in each paper and
- ii) 50% of the total marks in the examination.

## **ENTITLEMENT TO APPEAR AT THE ACADEMIC YEAR B.A. LL.B. (5 YEAR) INTEGRATED LAW COURSE**

A candidate who has completed his term for Semester I, III, V, VII and IX of the Five year B.A. LL.B. Course and has paid examination fees for such Semester Examination, shall be entitled to appear for any or all of such papers respectively along with the Semester II, IV, VI, VIII or X examination respectively.

Any student who has appeared for Semester I, III, V, VII or IX Examination of the five year B.A. LL.B., courses shall be entitled to re-appear for all or any of the papers along with the Semester II, IV, VI, VIII or X examination for improving his marks.

### **i Exemption**

A Candidate who obtains at least 50% of the full marks in a paper shall at his option be exempted from that paper at a subsequent examination. He / She shall however have to pass in the remaining paper or papers in accordance with the standard of passing laid down above. The benefit of exemption so earned may be available for six years only.

### **ii. First-Second Class**

At the end of the academic year, those of the successful candidates who obtained 50% or more of the total marks will be placed in the Second Class, and those who obtain 60% or more of the total marks will be placed in the First Class, and those who obtain 70% or more marks will be placed in First Class with Distinction.

### **iii. Allowed to Keep Terms**

A candidate who obtains at the 1st, 2nd, 3rd year of B.A. LL. B. or 4th year of B.A. LL. B. (Five year) B.A. LL .B. Course hereinafter earlier year 50% of the full marks in the number of subjects given below out of the total number of papers prescribed for the respective academic year shall be allowed to keep terms respectively for next year i.e. the 2nd, 3rd year of B.A. LL. B. and 4th and 5th year B.A. LL.B., Examination i.e. ATKT for 1/3 of the total subjects.

Provided however, that he shall not be declared to have passed the examination of such next

year, i.e. 2nd and 3rd year of B.A. LL.B., and 4th and 5th year of B.A. LL.B., unless he has passed such subjects and the remaining papers in the examination of such previous year according to the standard of passing laid down above. The same rules are applicable for LL.B. (3 year) course.

## **RULES OF ATTENDANCE AND PRACTICAL TRAINING**

### **CLASS ATTENDANCE**

Students shall attend at least 75% of lectures delivered in each subject/semester. Otherwise they are not eligible to write examinations at the end of each semester.

### **TUTORIALS FOR LL. B. / B.A. LL.B. COURSES**

Students shall write and attend the prescribed number of tutorials for each year to the satisfaction of the faculty.

### **JOURNAL WORK AND VIVA-VOCE EXAMINATION FOR LL. B./ B.A. LL.B. COURSES**

Under the scheme of Practical Training Programme, each student shall compulsorily maintain a Journal as may be prescribed by the institution for the clinical work done by him and from time to time regularly record in it the work allotted to and done by him in his own handwriting and the dates thereto under his signature and the same be scrutinized and counter signed from time to time by concerned Professor-in-charge. The journal shall be submitted to the institution for assessment. The Professor-in-charge or some other examiner or a panel of examiners from time to time or at the end of the term as per the discretion of the Principal of the College, shall assess the journal.

As per the syllabus prescribed for practical training paper, a Viva-Voice Examination shall be held on behalf of the University by a committee of two examiners (one external and one internal) to be appointed by the University who will ask questions to the students on the basis of the clinical work done by them and marks will be allotted to them accordingly.

### **DRESS CODE**

The dress code of the college for academic and other ceremonial activities is :

For Boys' : White Shirt, Black pant with black tie and black blazer.

For Girls' : White Salawar kurta / Saree with black blazer.

### **REFUND OF FEES ON CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION**

Cancellation of admission if applied for within 10 days from the commencement of the academic year, 20% of tuition fee will be deducted and the remaining balance will be refunded. If cancellation is applied for within 20 days from the commencement of the academic year, only 50% of tuition fee will be refunded. If cancellation is applied for after 20 days from the commencement of the academic year, no fee will be refunded.

## **GOVERNMENT FEE CONCESSION**

The students are entitled to receive the Government Fee concessions such as BC, EBC, PTC etc as per the Government norms. These eligible students shall be admitted on payment of nominal amount of fees to the college at the time of admission. Such students are required to submit their applications (in proforma) and/or other essential documents in the academy office at the time of admission. This will enable the college to forward their cases to the concerned Govt. offices without any delay. It will also help students in getting the concession amount as early as possible.

## **COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS, FREE STUDENT SHIPS, STUDENT'S AID**

The institution grants merit scholarship to merit students on the basis of their outstanding performance. Merit is determined on the basis of performance in examinations, regularity of attendance and participation in other academic activities of the institution. Financial aid under the STUDENTS AID FUND is given to deserving students on the basis of their regular attendance, tutorial work, good behaviour and progress during the term/semester. The management may grant fee concession also to the poor and deserving students.

## **COURT VISITS / ATTENDANCE AT LAWYER'S CHAMBER**

Students under the supervision of a Professor-in-charge shall visit at least three of the following places during such working day and timing as may be decided by the institution. The object of this course is to enable the students to understand the actual working in some of the departments and the documents maintained by them with a view to familiarize them.

The visits will be to any of the following places :

- Office of the Registrars, Clerks of Court,
- Nazirs, Record Keepers etc in courts,
- Police station
- Office of the Sub-Registrar under the Indian Registration Act
- Prison / Jail / Sub-jail

## **ATTENDANCE IN COURTS**

Each students shall be required to attend at least two cases or proceedings or interim petitions of courts, as far as possible from start to finish, arising out of the following :

1. Civil Suits
2. Criminal Cases
3. Sessions Cases
4. Small cause court proceedings or
5. Proceedings before a Co-operative court or a Labour court, or a Revenue court or any other court as may be decided by the Professor-in-charge.
6. Field visit to local areas and villages for Free Legal Aid Activities. Students shall be required to make their own notes and observations about the proceedings so visited

and attended by them including the facts of the proceedings, legal issues involved and record them in the journal maintained by them. The journal so maintained for this purpose shall be assessed for the purpose of allotting marks under practical training paper.

### **ATTENDANCE AT LAWYER'S CHAMBER**

Students under practical training paper shall attend the offices of advocates on such days and during such timings as the concerned Advocates may suggest. The object of this course is to enable a student to make himself conversant with the working in an Advocates office as to how he takes instructions from clients and so on. The observation made by the student shall be recorded in the journal under practical training paper and the same shall be assessed for allotment of marks.

### **CAREER PROSPECTS AFTER LL. B. DEGREE**

- Private Practice or Government Pleader and Public Prosecutor after enrollment as an Advocate with Bar Council of concerned state.
- Eligible to judicial and Administrative Services.
- Employment in non-government organizations like World Bank, United Nations etc.
- Opportunities in company services, LPOs (Legal Process Outsourcing) as Legal Officer, Legal Executive, or Legal Advisor.
- Establishment own Legal consultancy. Join as Legal Draftsman.
- Absorption as Legal Draftsmen in Ministry of Law and Affair, Govt of India, and Law officer in any Nationalize or Private Banks.
- Scope for Higher education and Research.
- Teaching in Colleges and Universities.

# COURSE STRUCTURE LL. M.

## LL. M. COURSE - LL. M. Course (2 Year Credit System)

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### Eligibility

The candidate should have completed B.A. LL.B. /LL.B. (Bachelor Degree of Law).

#### Admission

Admissions will be given as per the selection procedure / policies adopted by the respective college, in accordance with conditions laid down by the University of Pune / Rules framed by Government of Maharashtra from time to time.

#### Instructions for the Students

The students seeking admission to Master of Laws course is hereby informed that they are supposed to adhere to the following rules :

1. A minimum of 75 % attendance for lectures / practicals is the pre-requisite for grant of term.
2. The students are supposed to attend all the Internal Assessment Activities, Workshops/ Seminars/Training Programme/Symposia/Internal Tests/Presentations etc organized by the P.G. Department / college.

#### Examination

##### I) Evaluation of Students

1. The Internal and External examinations will have equal weightage of 50% each.
2. A Student has to obtain 50% marks in both examinations of Internal and External with minimum passing of 40% in both of these examinations separately.
3. A student cannot register for third semester, if he/she fails to complete any 6 papers consisting of 24 credits, out of total 8 papers of first and second semester consisting of 32 credits in total.
4. The external examination answer papers shall be evaluated by Central Assessment Programme.
5. There shall be a revaluation of the answer scripts of External Examination but not of Internal Assessment as per Ordinance No. 134A & B.
6. While marks are given for all internal and external examinations for a maximum number of 50 each, they will be converted into grades by University. Semester end grade sheets will have only grades & final grade sheets and transcripts shall have grade points average and total percentage of marks. The final grade sheets will also indicate the P.G. Center to which the candidate belongs.
7. Internal marks remain unchanged and internal assessment cannot be repeated. If a student remain absent during internal assessment examination, he/she will have second chance with the permission of the competent authority. It will be under the

discretion of the competent authority and internal departmental assessment committee. In case he/she wants to repeat Internal, he/she can do so only by registering for the said courses.

**A) External Examination**

1. External Examination for the 50% marks will be conducted by the University of Pune.
2. The External examination programme will be scheduled as per the notifications and guidelines issued by the Examination section of University of Pune.

**B) Internal Examination**

Internal assessment for each course would be continuous and dates for each tutorials/practical tests etc. will be pre-notified in the time table for teaching or placed separately as a part of time table. The P. G. Department / College Internal Assessment Committee will coordinate this activity.

**Internal Assessment**

1. It is a continuous evaluation process. The Internal marks will be evaluated on the basis of the following i.e. attendance, punctuality, practical skills, and oral skills etc.,
2. Assessment of internal work will be conducted before conducting External examination.
3. Longish Term Paper will be evaluated by the examiners of the same college and the dissertation will be evaluated by one internal and one external examiner.
4. Internal assessment for each paper shall be based on the following criteria :

The student has to carry the research work from 3<sup>rd</sup> semester onwards by selecting the topic and guide of the dissertation duly approved by the P. G. Departmental Committee. (No external examination for Dissertation)

5. All the Internal Assessment written test papers/assignments duly checked will be issued to the students for perusal and return. A teacher may propose any other means towards Internal Assessment that may suit for a particular course and implement only after the approval of the P.G. Departmental Committee of the College constituted by the Principal of the college.
6. If a student fails to gain the credits of any course (declared F grade in that course) then the student can re-attempt the course with internal assessment (if the course is conducted in that semester) and External Examination both or with External Examination only (if one has scored 20 marks in Internal assessment) in the subsequent External Examination (max. two such attempts) within a period of 4 years from the date of admission for the first semester.
7. In case a student fails to earn the minimum number of credits required for obtaining a degree within the stipulated period of 4 years, then such a student will be declared INCOMPLETE EXIT and in such a case the student can seek a fresh admission as per the admission rules prevailing at that time.

## **II) ATKT Rules**

A student cannot register for third/fourth semester, if he/she fails to complete six papers consist of 24 % credits of total eight papers consist of 32 credits and he/ she is expected ordinarily to complete within two semesters.

## **III) Award of Class**

Grades will be awarded from grade point average (GPA) of the credits.

## **IV) Assessment and Grade point average**

1. The system of evaluation will be as follows: Each internal assessment and External Examination will be evaluated in terms of marks. The marks for internal assessment and External Examination will be added together and then converted into a grade and later a grade point average.
2. Results will be declared for each semester.
3. After the gain of minimum number of credits towards a completion of a PG programme, a student will get a grade sheet with total grades earned and a grade point average.

- 4.2 If the (C)GPA is higher than the indicated upper limit in the three decimal digit, then higher final grade will be awarded (e.g. a student getting (C)GPA of 4.492 may be awarded 'A' grade).
- 4.3 There will be only final compilation and moderation at CGPA (Final) level. While declaring the result, the existing relevant ordinances are applicable. There is also a provision for verification and revaluation in case of verification, the existing rules will be applicable. The revaluation result will be adopted if there is a change of at least 10% marks and in the grade of the course.
- 4.4 For grade improvement a student must reappear for External Examination for a minimum 20 credits. These courses will be from the parent Department (subject). A student can appear only once for the Grade Improvement Program only after the successful completion of PG Degree program and at the end of the next academic year after completion of the Degree and within two years of completion of the Degree.
- 4.5 The formula for (C) GPA will be based on Weighted Average. The final (C) GPA will not be printed unless a student earns minimum 64 credits.

#### The description for the grades is as follows

##### **O: Outstanding : Excellent analysis of the topic, (75% and above)**

Accurate knowledge of the primary material, wide range of reading, logical development of

ideas, originality in approaching the subject, Neat and systematic organization of content, elegant and lucid style;

**A: Very Good: Excellent analysis of the topic (65 to 74%)**

Accurate knowledge of the primary material, acquaintance with seminal publications, logical development of ideas, Neat and systematic organization of content, effective and clear expression;

**B: Good: Good analysis and treatment of the topic (55 to 64%)**

Basic knowledge of the primary material, logical development of ideas, Neat and systematic organization of content, effective and clear expression;

**C: Average: Some important points covered (50 to 54%)**

Basic knowledge of the primary material, logical development of ideas, Neat and systematic organization of content, good language or expression;

**D: Satisfactory: Some points discussed (45 to 49%)**

Basic knowledge of the primary material, some organization, acceptable language or expression;

**E: Pass: Any two of the above (40 to 44%)**

**F: Fail: None of the above (0 to 39%)**

**V) Setting & Pattern of Question Paper**

For core (compulsory) theory courses end-semester question papers will be set by the University of Pune and centralized assessment for theory papers will be done as per the University instructions. Questions should be designed to test the conceptual knowledge and understanding of the basic concepts of the subject.

As the students are going to be admitted on the basis of branch specialization at the time of application itself, the students should necessarily finalize the dissertation topic in the end of the first semester and finalize the synopsis with tentative chapterization in the first month of the second semester. If any student fails to adhere to the rules such cases may be decided by the P.G. Departmental Committee of the college whether such student may be permitted/ whether to submit the dissertation in the fourth semester or in the subsequent semester. This rule has to be used only in exceptional circumstances not as a general norm. The decision of the departmental committee shall be final and no further appeal is entertain.

The P. G. Department of the college will display the attendance of each student two weeks before the final examination. If any student secures less than the prescribed attendance by the University such students are not eligible to take the examination in that semester. They have to redo such course in which they have shortage of attendance only when the semester repeats. Only in exceptional cases the P. G. Departmental Committee of the college may permit such genuine students if they have more than 70% of attendance in such subject.

### **PH. D. RESEARCH CENTRE IN LAW**

A.K. K. New Law Academy has been granted Ph. D Research Centre in Law subject by Savitribai Phule Pune University from Academic Year 2013-14. The admission for Ph. D and the related course activities will be carried out in the centre basing upon the availability of the Ph. D seats of the Ph. D guides attached to this centre. The Ph.D. programme at our college consists of course work for one semester followed by research work leading to a doctoral degree.

Library has CCTV system to monitor activities of students and other patrons towards security and safety issue.


#### **E-LIBRARY (COMPUTER INTERNET ROOM)**

## RULES OF DISCIPLINE

Students must observe silence in the college premises. They must not loiter in the garden and passage and corridors after the classes have begun. They must read quietly in the Library and spend other spare time in such a way as not to cause disturbance to others.

Students must be punctual and regular in attendance with minimum of 75% attendance of lectures held. It is mandatory for students to attend all the Seminars, Symposia, Workshops, Legal Aid Camps, Guest Lecturer and Other Co-Curricular activities organised by College, failing which they will not be eligible to appear the examination.

No society or association of the students will be started without the previous permission of the principal. No person shall be invited to address or entertain the students of the college without the previous permission of the Principal.

Every student shall undertake to abide by Ordinance No. 157 of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune pertaining to maintenance of discipline and good conduct by students, as provided for under Ordinances framed under the Maharashtra Universities Act or such other laws in force.

Every student of the college is provided an identity card. He/She should always carry it with him/her in and outside the college and should produce it whenever called upon to do so by the relevant authorities. No student of the college should travel without his/her identity card. Every candidate for the examination shall produce this card at time of university examination.

The students are bound by all the rules and regulations laid down by the college from time to time. Any matter not expressly provided for in these rules shall vest at the absolute decision of the Principal who also reserves the right of modifying these rules as and when felt necessary.

To safeguard its ideals of character and personal behavior, the college reserves the right to expel any student at anytime for any reason deemed sufficient by the Principal as misbehavior in the institute.

The Principal reserves the right to remove from the rolls the name of any student for failure to pay the college dues in time.

Students are required to read the notices put up on the notice boards of the college. The college shall not accept any responsibility for any loss / damage incurred by a student owing to his / her failure to read the notice in time.

Smoking, Chewing Pans, Gutkha, Tobacco, (Alcohol) and use of 'Drugs' are strictly prohibited in the premises of the college.

Any one found indulging in ragging in any form within or outside the college should be instantly expelled from the college and action will be initiated as per relevant act, statutes passed by Govt/Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.
